2012 SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Recognizing Academic Excellence

The scholarship opportunities listed in this brochure will be awarded based on a student's academic achievements, individual goals, and faculty recommendations. While awards will be made regardless of personal or family financial status, preference will be given to those presently not receiving any other form of financial aid. Preference will also be given to residents of College District 510, unless otherwise noted in the scholarship description.

These scholarships have been established through the generosity of businesses, associations, and individuals. The criteria for each scholarship vary. Eligibility requirements have been established by the donors. The following must be submitted no later than March 22, 2012 to be considered for the following academic year.

- ◆ Completed application.
- ◆ Personal statement of 250 words or less stating why the scholarship is important to your personal career goals.
- ◆ One letter of recommendation from a faculty member.
- ◆ Current transcript of grades.

Scholarship announcements will be made by April, with an awards ceremony to be held on April 30, 2012. Scholarship awards may be used to cover the cost of tuition, books, and up to \$150 in academic supplies unless otherwise noted. In some cases, scholarship recipients must maintain eligibility requirements for each semester the scholarship is awarded. Scholarships must be used within the following academic year unless otherwise noted. Students with financial aid must use their financial aid prior to scholarship award money. Scholarship recipients may be featured in college publications and local newspapers.



SOUTH SUBURBAN COLLEGE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS SPONSORED BY UPS

Four (4) \$1000 Scholarships sponsored by United Parcel Service will be awarded to 2012 Graduating High School students for use in the following Summer, Fall or Spring semester.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5.
- ♦ May be a full or part-time student.
- ♦ Must enroll in minimum of six credit hours.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES SCHOLARSHIP

The Board of Trustees Scholarship is a non-need-based, two-year award made to outstanding graduating high school seniors who have resided or attended high school in South Suburban College District 510 during their entire senior year. These scholarships cover a maximum of 12 credit hours per semester for Fall and Spring semesters only.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Applicant must be a senior at any of the following high schools: Bremen, Hillcrest, Illiana Christian, Luther East, Oak Forest, Seton Academy, Thornton, Thornton Fractional North, Thornton Fractional South, Thornridge, Thornwood, Tinley Park or reside in District 510 and attend high school during his or her entire senior year.
- ♦ Ranking in the top 15 percent of high school graduating class or a 3.5 cumulative grade point average or above on a 4.0 scale.
- ♦ Must plan to enroll as a full-time student.
- ♦ Demonstrated proof of having applied for the Illinois Monetary Award and the Federal Pell Grant; this is a non-need-based scholarship, however.
- ♦ Application deadline: High School graduates who qualify may apply at any time prior to enrolling at SSC.

SSC FOUNDATION HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The SSC Foundation High School Scholarship Program will award up to a total of 36 scholarships each Spring/Summer to incoming high school graduates. Three \$750 scholarships are available to graduating seniors at each of the 12 high schools within Community College District 510. Students will be selected by the Foundation Scholarship Committee based on academic excellence, leadership ability, and sound character as determined from the application packet. Preference will be given to students in Tech Prep programs, but this is not required. Scholarships that are not utilized at one high school may be transferred to students from another high school to accommodate additional applicants after the initial deadline of March 22, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above on a 4.0 scale.
- ♦ Must submit a recommendation letter from a high school or technology educational instructor.

SOUTH SUBURBAN COLLEGE FOUNDATION

Five (5) South Suburban College Foundation Scholarships. The \$750 awards recognize outstanding academic performance.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours.
- ♦ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of nine credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.

SSC FOUNDATION INTERNATIONAL INTERCULTURAL STUDIES SCHOLARSHIP

The SSC Foundation International Intercultural Studies Scholarship is designed to assist in funding study in any one of several Illinois Consortium for International Studies and Programs (ICISP) sponsored study abroad programs and will be awarded in the Spring for use the following Summer, Fall or Spring semesters. The \$750 award may be applied toward tuition, fees, books and other expenses associated with these programs. Scholarship recipients are selected by a committee designated by the SSC Foundation; decisions of the committee are final.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- ♦ Must be enrolled for a minimum of three credit hours during semester of application.

SSC FOUNDATION AUSTRALIA SCHOLARSHIP

The SSC Foundation Australia Scholarship is designed to assist in funding in the Illinois Consortium for International Studies and Programs (ICISP) sponsored student abroad program in Australia. This scholarship covers all program fees, tuition, airfare and housing costs. Scholarship recipients are selected by a committee consisting of representatives from International Studies with an application deadline of November 1, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 15 College-level credit hours by the end of the semester of application.
- ♦ Must be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours during semester prior to departure.
- ♦ Must complete all appropriate application materials, including three letters of recommendation, a personal essay, and a personal interview. All materials may be obtained by contacting Albert Jackson at (708) 596-2000, ext. 2349.

SSC FOUNDATION CHINA SCHOLARSHIP

The SSC Foundation China Scholarship is designed to assist in funding study in the China Summer Program administered through South Suburban College. This scholarship covers all program fees, tuition, airfare and housing costs. Scholarship recipient is selected by a committee consisting of representatives from International Studies with an application deadline of November 1, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 15 college-level credit hours at South Suburban College by the end of the semester of application.
- ♦ Must be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours at South Suburban College during semester prior to departure.
- ♦ Must complete all appropriate application materials, including an application form, three letters of recommendation, a personal essay, and a personal interview.
- ♦ All materials may be obtained by contacting Albert Jackson at (708) 596-2000, ext. 2349.

SSC FOUNDATION COSTA RICA SCHOLARSHIP

The two SSC Foundation Costa Rica Scholarships assist in funding study in the Illinois Consortium for International Studies and Programs (ICISP) sponsored study abroad program in Costa Rica. This scholarship covers all program fees, tuition, airfare and housing costs. Scholarship recipients are selected by a committee consisting of representatives from International Studies with an application deadline of November 1, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 15 college-level credit hours by the end of the semester of application.
- ♦ Must be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours during semester prior to departure.
- ♦ Must complete all appropriate application materials, including three letters of recommendation, a personal essay, and a personal interview. All materials may be obtained by contacting Sangeeta Kumar at (708) 596-2000, ext. 2574.

SSC FOUNDATION AFRICA SCHOLARSHIP

The SSC Foundation Africa (Ghana) Scholarship is designed to assist in funding study in the South Africa Summer Program administered through the University Studies Abroad Consortium (USAC). This scholarship covers all program fees, tuition, airfare and housing costs. Scholarship recipients are selected by a committee consisting of representatives from International Studies with an application deadline of November 1, 2012.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 15 college-level credit hours by the end of the semester of application.
- ♦ Must be enrolled for a minimum of six credit hours during semester prior to departure.
- ♦ Must complete all appropriate application materials, including three letters of recommendation, a personal essay, and a personal interview. All materials may be obtained by contacting Albert Jackson at (708) 596-2000, ext. 2349.

SOUTH SUBURBAN COLLEGE FOUNDATION RETURNING ADULT SCHOLARSHIPS

South Suburban College Foundation Returning Adult Scholarships are \$750 awards presented to four returning adult students attending South Suburban College

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be a returning adult, age 28 or over.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours with a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least six credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.

SOUTH SUBURBAN COLLEGE FOUNDATION SUMMER SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

South Suburban College Foundation Summer School Scholarships will be awarded to 75 students in the Spring for use in the following Summer semester. The \$300 awards recognize outstanding academic performance by students attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in classes during the current Spring semester.

ABBY FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Abby Foundation, a philanthropic organization for women's charities in the south suburbs, is offering \$500 scholarships to deserving women who need assistance to attend South Suburban College in the Fall, either as a graduating high school senior or as a returning student. Qualities of leadership and service to the local community as well as evidence of good academic performance will be considered in selection.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.
- ♦ Must include latest transcript from high school or college.
- ♦ Preference given to applicants who are not receiving other financial aid.
- ♦ Must submit a narrative, 250 words or less, on why this scholarship is important to you and what your career goals are.
- ♦ Must submit an application form by March 1, 2012, to the Abby Foundation.

BUSINESS & CAREER INSTITUTE WORK FORCE DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIP

The Business & Career Institute Work Force Development Scholarship is a monetary award up to \$750 per short-term, non-credit training course offered by the College. The scholarship is intended for adults seeking to upgrade their employability skills. Up to four scholarships may be awarded in any calendar year. A committee designated by the management staff of the Business & Career Institute selects recipients. Decisions of the committee are final.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must submit an application form and/or narrative demonstrating financial need.
- ◆ Must demonstrate applicable link to current job or career goals.

CAROL MANNING STUDENT ASSISTANCE FUND

The Carol Manning Student Assistance Fund is supported through donations and managed by the South Suburban College Foundation. Awards of varying amounts of up to \$450 per student per academic year are processed prior to the Spring and Fall semesters to assist students with unmet educational costs. Students must exhibit proof of extreme financial need, the ability for successful matriculation, and have exhausted all other resources for assistance.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ New or continuing student in any major.
- ◆ Must demonstrate financial need.
- ◆ Demonstrated potential for academic success.

CHARLES & MARY BARTLETT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Charles & Mary Bartlett Memorial Scholarship will be awarded in the Spring for use in the following Fall, Summer or Spring semesters. The \$750 award covers educational costs, such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The recipient must provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member from the Social and Behavioral Sciences Department, and will be selected based on a combination of academic performance and leadership ability.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.
- ♦ Must provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member from the Social and Behavioral Sciences Department.

CHLEBICKI SCHOLARSHIP

The Chlebicki Scholarship will be awarded in the Spring for use in the following Summer, Fall, or Spring semesters. The \$750 award covers educational costs, such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The award recognizes outstanding academic accomplishment in construction technology or computer aided design by a student attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have declared a construction technology or computer aided design curriculum major.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours for the current Spring semester and have a minimum 3.0 grade point average.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of six credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.

CITY OF HARVEY 1ST WARD COMMUNITY-SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Purpose: To promote community volunteerism in 1st Ward residents, and encourage ongoing continuing education.

Funded by: Shirley Drewenski, 1st Ward Alderman. Alderman Drewenski in conjunction with South Suburban College (SSC) will offer grant scholarships valued up to \$100 per semester at SSC through their Continuing Education Department for individuals over the age of 10 years. Value is based on Continuing Education course/program cost.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Applicants must be a 1st Ward resident from the City of Harvey.
- ♦ Applicants must have completed two (2) 1st Ward improvement projects pre-approved by the Ward Alderman. Example: resident #1 completed two pre-approved projects; resident earns one (1) scholarship for one class/program valued up to \$100. Resident #2 completed six (6) pre-approved projects; resident earns three (3) scholarship for (3) classes/programs valued up to \$300.
- ♦ If the applicant is a minor, written parent consent is required.

TERMS:

- ♦ The non-credit scholarship maximum of \$300 is to be utilized in one academic year and/or \$100 maximum of per semester for every two improvement projects completed.
- ♦ The candidate must complete an SSC application and 1st Ward Community-Service Improvement Project form along with an essay to describe the importance of community service and how volunteering benefited the applicant and community.

- ♦ The scholarship is non-refundable nor transferable to another individual.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- ♦ Applicant shall communicate with the 1st Ward Alderman via email at sdrewenski@yahoo.com for pre-approval and the SSC Foundation to determine eligibility and to confirm funding is still available.
- ♦ Student records will be reviewed by the Foundation staff and the 1st Ward Advisory Committee.
- ♦ The Foundation will review all applications to formulate each scholarship award decision. The Foundation will contact the applicant within four (4) business days to inform the applicant of the scholarship award decision.
- ♦ All denied applications will be re-examined by the 1st Ward Alderman before the final decision is made. All decisions are final and are made based on the criteria set forth.

CONSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY SCHOLARSHIP

The Construction Technology Scholarship is a South Suburban College Board of Trustees Scholarship. This scholarship is a full tuition waiver to be awarded in the Spring for use in the following Fall or Spring semester.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Shall be a graduating high school senior who has maintained a 2.0 grade point average.
- ♦ Must enroll as a full-time student (12 credit hours or more) in construction technology.
- ♦ Must be a resident of District 510.
- ♦ Must submit an application form and two letters of recommendation from a faculty member of the applicant's high school.

SELECTION PROCESS:

- ♦ A three-member selection team will judge applications submitted by eligible candidates. Team members shall be chosen by the Vice-President for Academic Affairs, with at least one of the members being a full-time / faculty member in the South Suburban College Building Construction Technology Department.

DURATION OF TUITION WAIVER:

- ♦ A student shall be entitled to financial coverage for the necessary credit and/ or development hours needed to receive the degree. A minimum "C" average must be maintained for the duration of the tuition waiver award.

DEAN SAYRE/VANGUARD TOUR SERVICE SCHOLARSHIP

The Dean Sayre/Vanguard Tour Service Scholarships are two \$300 awards to assist in the educational development of students majoring in music.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled as a full-time student.
- ♦ Must be enrolled as a music major.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in MUS 197 (jazz ensemble).
- ♦ Awarded in the Fall semester of the academic year by the Instrumental Music Director.
- ♦ Preference given to applicants who are not receiving other financial aid.
- ♦ Must audition for the Instrumental Music Director and/or Music Faculty.
- ♦ Selection will be based on appearance and musical ability.

DOCTER ENTERPRISES, BERT J. DOCTER SECOND CHANCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Docter Enterprises, Bert J. Docter Second Chance Scholarship will be awarded in the Spring for use in the following Summer, Fall and Spring semesters. The \$1,000 award covers educational costs, such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The award recognizes outstanding community service by students attending South Suburban College. Preference will be given to graduates of the college's GED program.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must demonstrate outstanding community service (as determined by the Foundation Scholarship Committee).
- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or above.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in classes during the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Preference given to GED graduates and applicants who are not receiving other financial aid or employment subsidy.

DON KRAMER MEMORIAL MUSIC SCHOLARSHIP

The Don Kramer Memorial Music Scholarships are two \$500 awards to assist in the educational development of students majoring in Music.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled as a full-time student.
- ♦ Must be enrolled as a music major.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in MUS 197 (jazz ensemble) and MUS 195 (symphonic band).
- ♦ Awarded in the Fall semester of the academic year by the Instrumental Music Director.
- ♦ Must audition for the Instrumental Music Director and/or Music Faculty.

DONNA J. YUKICH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Donna J. Yukich Memorial Scholarship is a \$1,000 award for a new or continuing student at SSC.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ May be a new or continuing student.
- ♦ Must have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher.
- ♦ Must enroll in a minimum of 9 credit hours.
- ♦ Must be a resident of Lake County, Indiana.
- ♦ Recipient will be selected by committee as determined by the scholarship's founder.

DR. GLORIA J. TAYLOR COMMUNITY EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Dr. Gloria J. Taylor Community Education Scholarship will be awarded each year to a GED graduate who earned between 2,750 and 2,999 points on his/her GED Examination. The \$1,600 award covers tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The recipient will be selected by Dr. Gloria Taylor, and the Community Education Scholarship will be presented at South Suburban College's 2012 Spring GED Graduation.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have attended and graduated from South Suburban College's GED Program in 2011-12 school year.
- ♦ Must have earned between 2,750 and 2,999 points on the GED Test.
- ♦ Must attend Spring 2012 GED Graduation.
- ♦ Must enroll as a full-time student at South Suburban College for the 2012-13 school year.

ELIZABETH M. GONZALEZ-AVILA MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Elizabeth M. Gonzalez Avila Memorial Scholarship will award up to \$1,000 to a deserving Latino student. The award covers educational costs, such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The scholarship was established by the SSC Counseling staff and friends. It is supported through donations and managed by the college Foundation

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Graduating high school seniors and current SSC students with a 2.5 GPA, or returning adults.

FRANCIS MEYER - BANK CALUMET SCHOLARSHIPS

Two Francis Meyer - Bank Calumet Scholarships will be awarded for \$1,000 each based on academic performance, with preference given to Indiana residents.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.

FRANK J. PAVELIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Frank J. Pavelin Memorial Scholarship \$750 award recognizes artistic talent and dedication by a student attending or entering South Suburban College who designates an area of the fine arts as a curriculum major.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have declared visual or performing art as a curriculum major.
- ♦ Must enroll for six credit hours during one of the semesters of the scholarship year.

FRANK L. GRIFFIN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Frank L. Griffin Memorial Scholarship is a \$750 award with preference given to a journalism student. Secondly, to a student who is majoring in business.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a 3.0 grade point average.
- ♦ Must have a minimum of 15 credit hours.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of six credit hours.

FRANK ZUCCARELLI–THORNTON TOWNSHIP SCHOLARSHIP

The Frank Zuccarelli–Thornton Township Scholarship will be awarded to a South Suburban College student in the Spring for use throughout their academic career at SSC. The \$2,500 award covers all educational costs such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. The recipient will be selected based on the best demonstration of leadership ability and community involvement.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must have a 3.0 grade point average.
- ◆ Must enroll for a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- ◆ Must be a resident of Thornton Township and School District 510.
- ◆ South Suburban College staff, Foundation Directors, and the Board of Trustees and their dependents are not eligible.

GELITA USA – CHICAGO GELATINE SCHOLARSHIP

The GELITA USA – Chicago Gelatine Scholarships are presented to two SSC students for use in the Summer, Fall or Spring semesters. The two \$1000 scholarship awards will recognize returning adults or freshmen students attending South Suburban College. The scholarship award covers educational costs such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must enroll in a minimum of nine credit hours per semester.
- ◆ Must have a 2.7 grade point average.
- ◆ Must submit an application form and two letters of recommendation.
- ◆ Must be a resident of District 510.
- ◆ Priority given to applicants who are not receiving other financial aid or employer subsidy.
- ◆ South Suburban College staff, Foundation directors, Board of Trustees members and their dependents are not eligible.
- ◆ Preference given to family members of GELITA USA – Chicago employees, and residents of Calumet City.

GEORGE DAMMER SCHOLARSHIP FOR GED GRADUATES

The George Dammer Scholarship for GED Graduates will be awarded to a student who has graduated from the South Suburban College GED program. Two \$750 scholarships will be presented in the Spring for use in the Summer, Fall or Spring semesters at South Suburban College. The award may be used for tuition, books or fees.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ A minimum GED test score of 2,750 and official proof of receiving the GED Certificate for the State of Illinois.
- ♦ Recipient must enroll in college credit classes within two semesters after receiving the official GED Certificate.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of nine credit hours.

GRACE LEFEBVRE SCHOLARSHIP

The Grace Lefebvre Scholarship \$750 award recognizes academic achievement by a student attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of six credit hours at South Suburban College.
- ♦ Must have a grade point average of 2.75.
- ♦ Must have declared a major leading to a certificate or degree.

HARRIS BANK SCHOLARSHIPS

The Harris Bank Scholarships are \$750 awards given to students enrolled in SSC Business programs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.

HUI-LING HITE SCHOLARSHIP

The Hui-Ling Hite Scholarship \$750 award recognizes academic achievement by a student attending South Suburban College that has studied English as a second language at SSC.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must have completed a minimum of 12 credit hours with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above at South Suburban College.
- ◆ English is the student's second language and he/she must have studied English in the ESL Program and must provide documentation.



ILLINOIS EDUCATION FOUNDATION SIGNATURE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM AT SSC

The Illinois Education Foundation (IEF) Signature Scholarship Program can help pay for school and much more. The IEF scholarship provides “last dollar” financial assistance which covers the remaining balance of tuition and fees, if any, after financial aid has been applied. IEF Scholars also receive a need-based stipend award of up to \$750 per semester to cover books and supplies. The IEF also provides a complete set of supports for community college students to help them succeed in school and in life. Students selected as an IEF Scholar will become a member of a community of students, volunteers and supporters committed to ensuring their academic, professional and personal goals. IEF Scholars benefit from financial, academic, and professional development opportunities including:

- ◆ Mentors for career advice
- ◆ Monthly professional and personal development workshops
- ◆ Intensive academic advising
- ◆ Free one-on-one tutoring in any academic subject
- ◆ Tuition assistance and a stipend to defray other educational costs the cost of books, uniforms, and transportation

ELIGIBILITY:

ILLINOIS HEALTH IMPROVMENT ASSOCIATION (IHIA) SCHOLARSHIPS

The Illinois Health Improvement Association Scholarship is an \$800 award that may be used for tuition, books, syllabi/study guides, or expenses directly related to his/her health profession program. The recipient of the Illinois Health Improvement Association Scholarship (IHIA) should be a student who is enrolled in a healthcare program that provides direct medical care to individuals, such as the Associate Degree Nursing (ADN), Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA), Practical Nursing (PN), and Radiologic Technology (RAD) Programs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be a resident of the State of Illinois.
- ◆ Must have “demonstrated financial need” including middle-income students.
- ◆ Must be in good academic standing as defined by a student possessing a cumulative grade point average of 3.25.
- ◆ Must submit a one-page typed narrative describing what or who inspired him or her to choose the field that they are currently enrolled in and what he or she envisions his or her future role as a caregiver to be.
- ◆ Selection of award recipients will be made by a faculty committee representing the respective Allied Health and Nursing Programs. Selection criteria will not be based on race, creed, sex, religion, or national origin.

J. ALBERT KINDIG MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Office of Communications and Humanities of South Suburban College is accepting applications for a \$1,000 monetary scholarship in memory of the late Dr. J. Albert Kindig.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Mrs. Kindig reviews materials, interviews finalists and makes the final selection.

JANE DILLON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Jane Dillon Memorial Scholarship is a \$1,000 award for a new student entering South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY

- ◆ Must have a grade point average of 2.75 or higher.
- ◆ Must enroll in a minimum of 9 credit hours.
- ◆ Must be a resident of Lake County, Indiana.
- ◆ Recipient will be selected by committee as determined by the scholarship's founder.

JEAN SEDLACK SCHOLARSHIP

The Jean Sedlack Scholarship \$750 award recognizes outstanding academic performance in foreign language by a student attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours, including one foreign language course, with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above at South Suburban College.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a minimum of three credit hours for current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a program leading to a certificate or degree.

JE & HENRETTA RICHMOND SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The JE & Henretta Richmond Scholarship is presented to one student in the Spring for use in the following Summer, Fall or Spring semesters. The \$750 award recognizes a full-time student majoring in Nursing, Finance, or Education at South suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours or have been enrolled in 12 the previous semester.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in the Nursing program, or studying Finance or Education.

JIM STEIMLE INFORMATION SYSTEMS SCHOLARSHIP

The Jim Steimle Information Systems Scholarship \$750 award is presented to a returning adult student to continue or complete a degree in information systems or a related curriculum leading to employment or providing a first step toward a Bachelor's degree at a senior college or university. Qualities of leadership and service to the local community as well as evidence of good academic performance will be considered in selection.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least three credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have successfully completed at least six credit hours of coursework with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of three credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.
- ♦ Must have a declared major in information systems leading to a certificate or degree.
- ♦ Special consideration will be given to single parents over age 25.

JOE ADAMEK ACCOUNTING SCHOLARSHIP

The Joe Adamek Accounting Scholarship is a \$750 award for a student attending South Suburban College who has declared Accounting as a major leading to a certificate or degree.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least six credit hours for the current Spring semester with a grade point average of 3.0 or above.
- ♦ Must have completed Accounting 120 & 121.

JOHN SAPHIR SCHOLARSHIP

The John Saphir Scholarship \$750 award is given to students enrolled in South Suburban College Business programs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or above.
- ◆ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours at South Suburban College.
- ◆ Must be enrolled in a minimum of three credit hours for current Spring semester.
- ◆ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a program leading to a certificate or degree.

JOHN SLAGER, SR. MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The John Slager, Sr. Memorial Scholarship is a \$750 award for a returning adult student of South Suburban College. Qualities of leadership and service to the local community as well as evidence of good academic performance will be considered in selection.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be enrolled in at least six credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ◆ Must have completed at least 12 credit hours with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ◆ Must enroll for a minimum of nine credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.
- ◆ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.

THE KAREN TEWS RETURNING ADULT SCHOLARSHIP

The Karen Tews Returning Adult Scholarship \$750 award recognizes a returning adult student attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be a returning adult, age 25 or over.
- ◆ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours with a 2.7 grade point average (cumulative or last semester attended).
- ◆ Must be enrolled in at least 4.5 credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ◆ Must enroll for a minimum of 4.5 credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.
- ◆ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.
- ◆ Preference given to applicants who are not receiving other financial aid or employer subsidy and are employees of Midwest Sintered Products Corporation.
- ◆ Second preference is given to students who reside in the Riverdale/Dolton area.



LAND O'FROST SCHOLARSHIP

The Land O'Frost Scholarship is a \$750 award given to a talented student attending or entering the South Suburban College finance, business, or related programs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must enroll for a minimum of six credit hours during one of the semesters of the scholarship year.
- ◆ Preference given to students who are who are Land O'Frost employees, or family members of Land O'Frost employees.

LOUISE J. PAVELIN RETURNING ADULT SCHOLARSHIP

The Louise J. Pavelin Returning Adult Scholarship is a \$750 award presented to one student enrolled in the education or nursing programs of South Suburban College

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be a returning adult, age 25 or over.
- ◆ Must have a 3.0 grade point average or better.
- ◆ Must be enrolled for a minimum of 12 credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.
- ◆ Selection of award recipient will be made by Ms. Lou Ann Pavelin.

McKENDREE COLLEGE/ILLINOIS COMMUNITY COLLEGE SYSTEM FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PARTNERSHIP

The McKendree College/Illinois Community College System Foundation Partnership Scholarship will provide two scholarships valued at \$10,000 per year (\$20,000 over two years) to South Suburban College Phi Theta Kappa graduates. This scholarship program will assist two qualified and deserving graduates in obtaining their baccalaureate degree at McKendree College, an outstanding private, liberal arts college here in Illinois.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be a resident of the state of Illinois.
- ◆ Must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) each year.
- ◆ Must have a cumulative GPA of 3.6 or higher.
- ◆ Must be a member of Phi Theta Kappa.
- ◆ Must have completed the equivalent of four semesters at South Suburban College.
- ◆ Must be recommended by South Suburban College.
- ◆ Apply and be admitted to McKendree College.

ADDITIONAL REGULATIONS:

- ◆ Students are eligible for all sources of state and federal aid (MAP, PELL, Stafford Loans, SEOG, etc.) It should be noted that Foundation Scholars will not be eligible for other sources of McKendree College Financial aid (athletic, co-curricular, academic or otherwise) above and beyond the \$8,500 Foundation Scholarship and the \$1,500 Phi Theta Kappa award for entering transfer students.
- ◆ The Foundation Scholarship is eligible to undergraduate students attending full-time at McKendree College's main campus (not available for completion programs).
- ◆ Foundation Scholars must achieve a cumulative GPA of 3.0 at the end of their second semester in order to renew their scholarship for the following year.
- ◆ The Foundation Scholarship is not renewable beyond four semesters.

- ◆ Selection of the Foundation Scholars will be made solely at the discretion of the administration of McKendree College.

MI-JACK PRODUCTS EDUCATIONAL FUND

The Mi-Jack Products Scholarships are three \$1,000 awards for full-time students enrolled in SSC Engineering programs.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5 or above.

NEXT CAREER SCHOLARSHIP

The Next Career Scholarships are five \$750 awards for students who complete a Bachelor's Degree and are returning to South Suburban College to pursue a second degree. The \$750 scholarships are awarded to returning adult students enrolled in a specific career program of study leading to employment.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least six credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have completed at least 9 credit hours with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Must provide evidence of having received Bachelor's Degree.
- ♦ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.

NORMA ROONEY SCHOLARSHIP

The Norma Rooney Scholarship is presented to one student each Spring for use in the following Summer, Fall or Spring semesters. The \$750 award recognizes outstanding academic performance by a student attending South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled in at least nine credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have completed at least nine credit hours during the previous Fall semester with a 3.0 or above grade point average.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.
- ♦ Must enroll for a minimum of nine credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.

PATRICIA CHASE MAGON JOURNALISM SCHOLARSHIPS

The Patricia Chase Magon Journalism Scholarship is a \$1,000 award to a deserving student studying journalism. Qualities of leadership and service to the local community will be considered in selection.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0.
- ♦ Preference given to South Holland residents.

The Patricia Chase Magon Journalism Scholarship is sponsored by Dr. John Magon and other generous donors.

PBI ENDOWMENT FUND

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a minimum of six credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ♦ Must have a declared major and/or be enrolled in a specific program leading to a certificate or degree.
- ♦ Must enroll in at least six credit hours for the upcoming Fall semester.
- ♦ Must submit a letter of recommendation from a South Suburban College faculty member.
- ♦ Must have resided in the Village of Dolton for at least one year.

REGSON SCHOLARSHIP

The Regson Scholarship is a \$1,500 award for a 12 or 15 credit hour Basic Certificate Program approved by the Division of Community Education at South Suburban College.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be a Harvey resident.
- ♦ Must submit a high school transcript, an official GED or college transcript.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a 12-15 hour program leading to a certificate.
- ♦ Must take the Placement Test in reading, English, and mathematics.
- ♦ Must complete all admissions requirements for the Certificate Program of your choice.
- ♦ Must complete College Orientation.

THE REVEREND CARTHAN MCKENZIE, SR. SCHOLARSHIP

The Reverend Cartha McKenzie, Sr. Scholarship is a \$750 award presented in the spring for use in the following Summer, Fall, or Spring Semesters.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be enrolled as a full-time student during each semester (12 credit hours or more).
- ♦ Shall be a graduating high school senior who has maintained a 2.5 grade point average or above.
- ♦ Demonstrated financial need.

SEAN LAURA ALUMNI SCHOLARSHIP

The Sean Laura Scholarship \$750 award recognizes a South Suburban College student who is studying criminal justice, court reporting, or in the paralegal program.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Preference given to any police officer who has become disabled as defined by the pension board of the officer's police department. The applicant may be the spouse or child of a police officer killed or permanently disabled as a result of injuries received in the line of duty or the spouse or child of an active police officer. The applicant must supply proof. These candidates may be studying in any curriculum.
- ♦ Must maintain a 3.0 grade point average.
- ♦ May be either a full or part-time student.
- ♦ Must have completed a minimum of nine credit hours.
- ♦ Must be enrolled in a program leading to an Associate degree.

SMITH V. BRAND SCHOLARSHIP

The Smith V. Brand Scholarship in the Fine or Performing Arts is a \$1,000 award recognizing outstanding academic performance with an emphasis in the Fine or Performing Arts; curricula or courses to be considered include: Art, Drama and Theater, Music, Creative Writing, or courses in the Performance Arts.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or above on a minimum of 12 hours.
- ◆ Must be enrolled in at least 12 credit hours for the current Spring semester.
- ◆ Must have completed or be completing at the time of the scholarship award a minimum of nine credit hours in the Fine or Performing Arts.

TERRENCE WRIGHT MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Terrence Wright Memorial Scholarship \$750 award is given to a deserving student whose interest in theater has been demonstrated in (in order of priority) scenic design and set construction; lighting, sound and makeup; or costuming, design and construction. If a student in the technical arts of the theater does not apply, then consideration will be given to primary interest in acting, directing, playwriting, or TV and radio.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ◆ Must be enrolled in a minimum of 12 semester hours for the Spring semester and have a minimum 2.7 grade point average.
- ◆ Must submit an application form plus a written statement including the student's theatrical accomplishments, such as scene designs, lighting designs, costume designs, roles performed, plays directed, sample writing, and TV or radio experience.
- ◆ Students whose primary interest is performance must demonstrate their ability through audition in the form of two, five-minute cuttings: one comedic and one serious.
- ◆ The student chosen will devote extra curricular time to the South Suburban College Theater Department as an active participant in the theater program offered at the school.
- ◆ Student must portray a desire to continue in theater as a vocation or avocation.

THEDA HAMBRIGHT SCHOLARSHIPS

The Theda Hambright Scholarships are \$500 awards presented each June at the annual GED graduation ceremony. Applicants must be nominated by a GED and/or ESL Instructor or Coordinator. Completed applications will be submitted and reviewed by the Theda Hambright Scholarship Fund Committee.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have studied at one of South Suburban College's GED programs.
- ♦ Must be a current GED graduate of South Suburban College.
- ♦ Must participate in a South Suburban College GED graduation ceremony.

THORNTON TOWNSHIP HISTORICAL SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

The Thornton Township Historical Society Scholarship is a \$750 award presented to a History student each Spring for use in the following Summer, Fall and Spring semesters. The award covers educational costs, such as tuition, fees and books at South Suburban College. Applicants must provide a letter of recommendation from an SSC History faculty member.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must be a current SSC student with a GPA of 3.0 or above.

VANEEKEREN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIPS

The VanEekeren Family Scholarships are three \$750 awards for a combination of academic progress (with a GPA between 2.25 – 3.25) and leadership ability. Applicant shall not have an “F” or “W” (failed or withdrew from class) on their transcript.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must have a cumulative grade point average between 2.25 – 3.25.

The Veteran’s Spouse Scholarship is a \$750 award for a spouse of a veteran or enlisted military personnel serving in either Iraq or Afghanistan.

ELIGIBILITY:

- ♦ Must provide evidence that student is the spouse of a veteran or enlisted military personnel serving in either Iraq or Afghanistan.
- ♦ Must have a 2.50 grade point average.
- ♦ May be a full or part-time student.
